

**“The Edge” Wednesday, February 17, 2010**  
**The Second Coming of Christ**

Read [Revelation 19:11-16](#) together and answer the following questions.

1. In Revelation 6:2 we see a rider on a white horse and now in verse 11 of chapter 19 we see another rider on a white horse. We know that the first rider is the Anti-Christ so who is this rider that is called Faithful and True?
2. In verse 14 when we see a heavenly army clothed in fine linen, white and clean that follow Jesus on white horses. Who is it that makes up this army? Is it the believers in Christ, the angels or both?
3. At this point Jesus is coming to judge and condemn the world. Discuss as a family if you think anyone can be saved at Jesus second coming (remember everything that has happened until this very point and all the opportunities the people of the earth have been given to repent and receive Christ).

Read [Revelation 19:17-21](#) together and answer the following questions.

1. We read in verse 19 that all the armies of the earth are gathered together with the beast (Anti-Christ) and the false prophet to wage war against Jesus and His army, but before the battle can even begin it is over. The beast and the false prophet are captured and thrown into the lake of fire and all the armies of the earth are killed. With that fresh in your mind, discuss a time when you worried whether God was going to be able to take care of you. Looking back and in light of what you just read, talk about if you still occasionally worry about God's provision in your life.
2. Discuss the following statement: “What does Christ's future victory mean for us now?”
3. Why was hell created and who was it created for? (Was it for Satan and his angels or for people?)
4. Parents discuss with your student/s the feelings that they have about the second coming of Christ. Discuss if you feel you will be coming back with Him or if you will be standing in front of Him to face judgment and condemnation. (Jesus loves you very much and He made a way for you to be with Him in Heaven for all eternity, it all starts and ends at the cross).
5. Pray as a family and give praise to God that He is in control of everything and that the final victory is His and His alone. Pray that God would make it clear to all of you that you are ready for His return. Rest in His promises and let His peace wash away any fears you may have of His return.
